Opening Sentences

Officiant Alleluia. ✝ Christ is risen.
People The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia.

Officiant Ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you;
and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea,
and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth. *Acts 1:8*

Confession of Sin

¶ The Officiant says

Dearly beloved, we have come together in the presence of Almighty God our heavenly Father, to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his holy Word, and to ask, for ourselves and on behalf of others, those things that are necessary for our life and our salvation. And so that we may prepare ourselves in heart and mind to worship him, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

¶ Officiant and People, all kneeling

Almighty and most merciful Father,
we have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep,
we have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts,
we have offended against thy holy laws,
we have left undone those things which we ought to have done,
and we have done those things which we ought not to have done;
And there is no health in us.
But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us,
spare thou those who confess their faults,

restore thou those who are penitent,
according to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord;
and grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake,
that we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life,
to the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

¶ The Officiant alone stands and says

The Almighty and merciful Lord grant you absolution  and remission of all your sins,
true repentance, amendment of life, and the grace and consolation of his Holy Spirit.

¶ People Amen.

¶ All stand

The Invitatory and Psalter

Officiant O Lord, open thou our lips.

People And our mouth shall show forth thy praise.

All Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit:
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen. Alleluia.

¶ All say the Pascha nostrum together, as follows

Alleluia;

Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us, *
therefore let us keep the feast,

Not with old leaven,
neither with the leaven of malice and wickedness, *
but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth. Alleluia.

Christ being raised from the dead dieth no more; *
death hath no more dominion over him.

For in that he died, he died unto sin once; *
but in that he liveth, he liveth unto God.

Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, *
but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord. Alleluia.

Christ is risen from the dead, *
and become the first fruits of them that slept.

For since by man came death, *
by man came also the resurrection of the dead.

For as in Adam all die, *
even so in Christ shall all be made alive. Alleluia.

in wisdom hast thou made them all; the earth is full of thy riches.

So is the great and wide sea also; *
wherein are things creeping innumerable, both small and great beasts.

There go the ships, and there is that leviathan, *
whom thou hast made to take his pastime therein.

These wait all upon thee, *
that thou mayest give them meat in due season.

When thou givest it them, they gather it; *
and when thou openest thy hand, they are filled with good.

When thou hidest thy face, they are troubled: *
when thou takest away their breath, they die, and are turned again to their dust.

When thou lettest thy breath go forth, they shall be made; *
and thou shalt renew the face of the earth.

The glorious majesty of the Lord shall endure for ever; *
the Lord shall rejoice in his works.

The earth shall tremble at the look of him; *
if he do but touch the hills, they shall smoke.

I will sing unto the Lord as long as I live; *
I will praise my God while I have my being.

And so shall my words please him: *
my joy shall be in the Lord. Hallelujah!

The Lessons

The First Lesson

ACTS 2:1-21

WHEN THE DAY OF PENTECOST HAD COME, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Par'thians and Medes and E'lamites and residents of Mesopota'mia, Judea and Cappado'cia, Pontus and Asia, Phryg'ia and Pamphyl'ia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyre'ne, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day; but this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 'And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; yea, and on my menservants and my maidservants in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show wonders in the heaven above and signs on the earth beneath, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; the sun shall be turned into darkness and the moon into blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and manifest day. And it shall be that whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'

The Second Lesson

JOHN 20:19-23

ON THE EVENING OF THAT DAY, the first day of the week, the doors being shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

We therefore pray thee, help thy servants,
whom thou hast redeemed with thy precious blood.
Make them to be numbered with thy saints,
in glory everlasting.

¶ Said by the Officiant and People together, all standing

I believe in God, the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth;
And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord;
who was conceived by the Holy Ghost,
born of the Virgin Mary,
suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, dead, and buried.
He descended into hell.
The third day he rose again from the dead.
He ascended into heaven,
and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father almighty.
From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.
I believe in the Holy Ghost,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body, †
and the life everlasting. Amen.

People Thy saving health among all nations.

Officiant Let not the needy, O Lord, be forgotten;

People Nor the hope of the poor be taken away.

Officiant Create in us clean hearts, O God;

People And sustain us with thy Holy Spirit.

The Collects

The Pentecost Blessing

Liturgical Music

The music opening this morning's liturgy is a short meditation on the theme *Veni, Creator Spiritus* (Come, Holy Spirit – Hymn #504) written for chamber orchestra by Robert Lehman.

The 15th-century Italian hymn, *Come down, O Love divine*, is an example of a pre-Reformation hymn of praise and devotion. Many hymns of the time were written by penitents who, frightened by the devastation of wars and plagues which surrounded them, sought atonement for sins by a deeper life of devotion. Vaughan Williams' beautiful tune, named *Down Ampney* for the village in which he was born, is perfectly suited to the introspective character of the text.

The anthem *Alleluia* by Randall Thompson (1899-1994), sung following the Sermon, was recorded during a celebration of the Holy Eucharist at Christ Church, New Haven, Connecticut. Its sweeping lines conjure up images of the wind at the coming of the Spirit. The Christ Church Choir is conducted by Robert Lehman, Organist and Choirmaster.

The Organ Voluntary concluding this morning's liturgy is the Chorale Fugue on *Kyrie: Gott heiliger Geist* (Kyrie: God the Holy Ghost) by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750). It was recorded at Christ Church, New Haven, Connecticut by Robert Lehman, Organist and Choirmaster.
