Opening Sentences

Officiant Let the words of my mouth, and the meditation of my heart, be alway acceptable in thy sight, O Lord, my strength and my redeemer. Psalm 19:14

Confession of Sin

¶ The Officiant says

Parly Beloved, we have come together in the presence of Almighty God our heavenly Father, to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his holy Word, and to ask, for ourselves and on behalf of others, those things that are necessary for our life and our salvation. And so that we may prepare ourselves in heart and mind to worship him, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

¶ Officiant and People, all kneeling

Almighty and most merciful Father, we have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep, we have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts, we have offended against thy holy laws, we have left undone those things which we ought to have done, and we have done those things which we ought not to have done; And there is no health in us.

But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us, spare thou those who confess their faults, restore thou those who are penitent, according to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord; and grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, that we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

¶ The Officiant alone stands and says

The Almighty and merciful Lord grant you absolution $\frac{1}{4}$ and remission of all your sins, true repentance, amendment of life, and the grace and consolation of his Holy Spirit. $\frac{1}{4}$ *People Amen.*

¶ All stand

The Invitatory and Psalter

Officiant O Lord, open thou our lips.

People And our mouth shall show forth thy praise.

All Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

When I called upon thee, thou heardest me; * and enduedst my soul with much strength.

All the kings of the earth shall praise thee, O Lord; * for they have heard the words of thy mouth.

Yea, they shall sing of the ways of the Lord, * that great is the glory of the Lord.

For though the Lord be high, yet hath he respect unto the lowly; * as for the proud, he beholdeth them afar off.

Though I walk in the midst of trouble, yet shalt thou refresh me; * thou shalt stretch forth thy hand upon the furiousness of mine enemies, and thy right hand shall save me.

The Lord shall make good his loving-kindness toward me; * yea, thy mercy, O Lord, endureth for ever; despise not then the works of thine own hands.

The Lessons

The First Lesson Isaiah 51:1-6

HUS SAYS THE LORD, "Hearken to me, you who pursue deliverance, you who seek the Lord; look to the rock from which you were hewn, and to the quarry from which you were digged. Look to Abraham your father and to Sarah who bore you; for when he was but one I called him, and I blessed him and made him many. For the Lord will comfort Zion; he will comfort all her waste places, and will make her wilderness like Eden, her desert like the garden of the Lord; joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and the voice of song. Listen to me, my people, and give ear to me, my nation; for a law will go forth from me, and my justice for a light to the peoples. My

deliverance draws near speedily, my salvation has gone forth, and my arms will rule the peoples; the coastlands wait for me, and for my arm they hope. Lift up your eyes to the heavens, and look at the earth beneath; for the heavens will vanish like smoke, the earth will wear out like a garment, and they who dwell in it will die like gnats; but my salvation will be for ever, and my deliverance will never be ended."

Exodus 15:1-6. 11-13, 17-18

I will sing unto the Lord, for he hath triumphed gloriously; * the horse and his rider hath he thrown into the sea.

The Lord is my strength and song, * and he is become my salvation:

He is my God, and I will prepare him an habitation; * my father's God and I will exalt him.

The Lord is a man of war: * the Lord is his name.

Pharaoh's chariots and his host hath he cast into the sea: * his chosen captains also are drowned in the Red Sea.

The depths have covered them:*
they sank into the bottom as a stone.

Thy right hand, O Lord, is become glorious in power: * thy right hand, O Lord, hath dashed in pieces the enemy.

Who is like unto thee, O Lord, among the gods?*
who is like thee, glorious in holiness, fearful in praises, doing wonders?

Thou stretchedst out thy right hand, * the earth swallowed them.

Thou in thy mercy hast led forth the people which thou hast redeemed: * thou hast guided them in thy strength unto thy holy habitation.

Thou shalt bring them in, and plant them * in the mountain of thine inheritance,

In the place, O Lord, which thou hast made for thee to dwell in; * in the sanctuary, O Lord, which thy hands have established.

The Lord shall reign * for ever and ever.

The Second Lesson Matthew 16:13-20

OW WHEN JESUS CAME INTO THE DISTRICT of Caesare'a Philip'pi, he asked his disciples, "Who do men say that the Son of man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, others say Eli'jah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jona! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the powers of death shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." Then he strictly charged the disciples to tell no one that he was the Christ.

Thou that takest away the sins of the world, receive our prayer.

Thou that sittest at the right hand of God the Father, have mercy upon us.

For thou only art holy; thou only art the Lord; thou only, O Christ, with the Holy Ghost, art most high in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Apostles' Creed

¶ Said by the Officiant and People together, all standing

I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth: And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, \(\frac{1}{2}\) and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Prayers

Officiant Lord, keep this nation under thy care;

People And guide us in the way of justice and truth.

Officiant Let thy way be known upon earth;

People Thy saving health among all nations.

Officiant Let not the needy, O Lord, be forgotten;

People Nor the hope of the poor be taken away.

Officiant Create in us clean hearts, O God;

People And sustain us with thy Holy Spirit.

Liturgical Music

The music that opens this morning's liturgy is the Three-Part Sinfonia XII in A major by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750). Originally composed for keyboard, it is here arranged for violin, oboe d'amore, and cello.

Today's hymn, from the 7th-century Latin, amplifies St. Paul's description of the Church in Ephesians 2:20-21, built upon the foundation of the Apostles and Prophets with Christ himself being the chief cornerstone. The tune, *Westminster Abbey*, is drawn from the final section of Henry Purcell's (1659-1695) verse anthem, O God, thou art my God. The recorded hymn heard today is an archival recording made by the CSMSG choir for this arrangement's publication by the Saint James Music Press (it can also be heard on the SJMP website). The arrangement is by the Canadian composer Rachel Aarons.

The anthem, *I will worship*, by George Dyson is a lilting setting of verses from the Psalm appointed for today. Its fresh, pastoral nature makes it an ideal anthem for the heat of Summer. Dyson served as Director of the Royal College of Music and was responsible for keeping it afloat during the Second World War which he did successfully, thus securing the future of British music education at the highest levels.

This morning's liturgy closes with J. S. Bach's Three-Part Sinfonia XIV in B-flat arranged for recorder, oboe d'amore, and cello.
