### **Opening Sentences**

#### Confession of Sin

#### ¶ The Officiant says

EARLY BELOVED, we have come together in the presence of Almighty God our heavenly Father, to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his holy Word, and to ask, for ourselves and on behalf of others, those things that are necessary for our life and our salvation. And so that we may prepare ourselves in heart and mind to worship him, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

# The Lessons

The First Lesson Genesis 28:10-17

Jacob Left Beer-Sheba and went toward Haran. And he came to a certain place, and stayed there that night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place to sleep. And he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven; and behold, the angels of God were ascending and descending on it! And behold, the Lord stood above it and said, "I am the Lord, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and to your descendants; and your descendants shall be like the dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south; and by you and your descendants shall all the families of the earth bless themselves. Behold, I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done that of which I have spoken to you." Then Jacob awoke from his sleep and said, "Surely the Lord is in this place; and I did not know it." And he was afraid, and said, "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven."

The Second Lesson John 1:47-51

Jesus saw Nathan'a-el coming to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you." Nathan'a-el answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, I saw you under the fig tree, do you believe? You shall see greater things than these." And he said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of man."



# Liturgical Music

The piece which opens today's liturgy is titled *Apotheosis*. Composed by Robert Lehman, it is a vision of the quiet tranquility that follows a great battle. The stillness invoked is intended to promote contemplation of the Archangel Michael's victory over the dragon and powers of darkness. It is played by the ARIA Chamber Orchestra.

The hymn *Sing alleluia forth in duteous praise* originated in the tenth century. Its theme is that of constant praises in heaven – as the Cherubim and Seraphin and all the Hosts of heaven sing one unending hymn of praise – even though our praises might be silenced here on earth. The grand tune *Martins*, to which it is sung, was composed for these words by Percy Carter Buck in the early twentieth century.

Richard Dering, composer of today's anthem, was an English Renaissance composer during the late Tudor period. He is particularly noted for his pioneering use of compositional techniques which anticipated the advent of Baroque music in England and today's anthem is an excellent example of just that. Composed for just two voices, the dialogue of the Seraphim is captured brilliantly through his use of Baroque techniques.

Thomas Roseingrave was an English-born Irish composer who, at an early age, was given a grant by the Dean of St. Patrick's Cathedral. Dublin to go to Italy to study composition. Throughout his career, opinions of his playing were varied and, in fact, ran the gamut of criticism. His heroic *Allegro pomposo* which closes today's liturgy, however, surely stands as a masterful example of his craft.



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
