Opening Sentences

Officiant He was despised and rejected; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. *Isaiah 53:3*

Confession of Sin

¶ The Officiant says

D EARLY BELOVED, we have come together in the presence of Almighty God our heavenly Father, to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his holy Word, and to ask, for ourselves and on behalf of others, those things that are necessary for our life and our salvation. And so that we may prepare ourselves in heart and mind to worship him, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

9 Officiant and People, all kneeling

Almighty and most merciful Father, we have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep, we have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts, we have offended against thy holy laws, we have left undone those things which we ought to have done, and we have done those things which we ought not to have done; And there is no health in us. But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us, spare thou those who confess their faults, restore thou those who are penitent, according to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord; and grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, that we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

¶ The Officiant alone stands and says

The Almighty and merciful Lord grant you absolution + and remission of all your sins, true repentance, amendment of life, and the grace and consolation of his Holy Spirit. *¶ People Amen.*

¶ All stand

The Invitatory and Psalter

- Officiant O Lord, open thou our lips. People And our mouth shall show forth thy praise.
- Officiant O God, make speed to save us. People O Lord, make haste to help us.
 - *All* Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

¶ All are then seated for the Psalm appointed for the evening

Psalm 74 Ut quid, Deus?

¶ The Psalm is read by the Officiant and Congregation, alternating by whole verse

O God, wherefore art thou absent from us so long? * why is thy wrath so hot against the sheep of thy pasture?

O think upon thy congregation, * whom thou hast purchased, and redeemed of old.

Think upon the tribe of thine inheritance, * and Mount Sion, wherein thou hast dwelt.

Lift up thy feet, that thou mayest utterly destroy every enemy, * which hath done evil in thy sanctuary.

Thine adversaries roar in the midst of thy congregations, * and set up their banners for tokens.

He that hewed timber afore out of the thick trees, * was known to bring it to an excellent work.

But now they break down all the carved work thereof * with axes and hammers.

They have set fire upon thy holy places, * and have defiled the dwelling place of thy Name, even unto the ground. Yea, they said in their hearts, Let us make havoc of them altogether: * thus have they burnt up all the houses of God in the land.

We see not our tokens; there is not one prophet more; * no, not one is there among us, that understandeth any more.

O God, how long shall the adversary do this dishonour? * shall the enemy blaspheme thy Name for ever?

Why withdrawest thou thy hand? * why pluckest thou not thy right hand out of thy bosom to consume the enemy?

For God is my King of old; * the help that is done upon earth, he doeth it himself.

Thou didst divide the sea through thy power; * thou brakest the heads of the dragons in the waters.

Thou smotest the heads of leviathan in pieces, * and gavest him to be meat for the people of the wilderness.

Thou broughtest out fountains and waters out of the hard rocks; * thou driedst up mighty waters.

The day is thine, and the night is thine; * thou hast prepared the light and the sun.

Thou hast set all the borders of the earth; * thou hast made summer and winter.

Remember this, O Lord, how the enemy hath rebuked; * and how the foolish people hath blasphemed thy Name.

O deliver not the soul of thy turtledove unto the multitude of the enemies; * and forget not the congregation of the poor for ever.

Look upon the covenant; * for all the earth is full of darkness and cruel habitations.

O let not the simple go away ashamed; * but let the poor and needy give praise unto thy Name.

Arise, O God, maintain thine own cause; * remember how the foolish man blasphemeth thee daily.

Forget not the voice of thine enemies: * the presumption of them that hate thee increaseth ever more and more.

¶ At the conclusion of the Psalmody the Gloria Patri is said by all

The Lessons

The First Lesson

LAMENTATIONS 2:1-9

W THE LORD in his anger has set the daughter of Zion under a cloud! He has cast down from heaven to earth the splendor of Israel; he has not remembered his footstool in the day of his anger.

The Lord has destroyed without mercy all the habitations of Jacob; in his wrath he has broken down the strongholds of the daughter of Judah; he has brought down to the ground in dishonor the kingdom and its rulers.

He has cut down in fierce anger all the might of Israel; he has withdrawn from them his right hand in the face of the enemy; he has burned like a flaming fire in Jacob, consuming all around.

He has bent his bow like an enemy, with his right hand set like a foe; and he has slain all the pride of our eyes in the tent of the daughter of Zion; he has poured out his fury like fire.

The Lord has become like an enemy, he has destroyed Israel; he has destroyed all its palaces, laid in ruins its strongholds; and he has multiplied in the daughter of Judah mourning and lamentation.

He has broken down his booth like that of a garden, laid in ruins the place of his appointed feasts; the Lord has brought to an end in Zion appointed feast and sabbath, and in his fierce indignation has spurned king and priest.

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The Lord has scorned his altar, disowned his sanctuary; he has delivered into the hand of the enemy the walls of her palaces; a clamor was raised in the house of the Lord as on the day of an appointed feast.

The Lord determined to lay in ruins the wall of the daughter of Zion; he marked it off by the line; he restrained not his hand from destroying; he caused rampart and wall to lament, they languish together.

Her gates have sunk into the ground; he has ruined and broken her bars; her king and princes are among the nations; the law is no more, and her prophets obtain no vision from the Lord.

And his mercy is on them that fear him * throughout all generations. He hath showed strength with his arm; * he hath scattered the proud in the imagination of their hearts. He hath put down the mighty from their seat, * and hath exalted the humble and meek. He hath filled the hungry with good things, * and the rich he hath sent empty away. He remembering his mercy hath holpen his servant Israel, * as he promised to our forefathers. Abraham and his seed for ever.

The Second Lesson

John 12:27-36

J ESUS SAID, "Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? No, for this purpose I have come to this hour. Father, glorify thy name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." The crowd standing by heard it and said that it had thundered. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgment of this world, now shall the ruler of this world be cast out; and I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself." He said this to show by what death he was to die. The crowd answered him, "We have heard from the law that the Christ remains for ever. How can you say that the Son of man must be lifted up? Who is this Son of man?" Jesus said to them, "The light is with you for a little longer. Walk while you have the light, lest the darkness overtake you; he who walks in the darkness does not know where he goes. While you have the light, believe in the light, that you may become sons of light." When Jesus had said this, he departed and hid himself from them.

The Apostles' Creed

9 Said by the Officiant and People together, all standing

I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth; And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. LUKE 2:29-32

He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Ghost, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, **H** and the life everlasting. Amen.

Officiant Endue thy ministers with righteousness. People And make thy chosen people joyful.

- Officiant Lord, keep this nation under thy care; People And guide us in the way of justice and truth.

Officiant Let thy way be known upon earth; People Thy saving health among all nations.

Officiant Let not the needy, O Lord, be forgotten; People Nor the hope of the poor be taken away. Officiant Create in us clean hearts, O God; People And sustain us with thy Holy Spirit.

RACIOUS FATHER, we pray for thy holy Catholic Church. Fill it with all truth, in all truth with all peace. Where it is corrupt, purify it; where it is in error, direct it; where in any thing it is amiss, reform it. Where it is right, strengthen it; where it is in want, provide for it; where it is divided, reunite it; for the sake of Jesus Christ thy Son our Savior. *f* People Amen.

GOD, whose fatherly care reacheth to the uttermost parts of the earth: We humbly beseech thee graciously to behold and bless those whom we love, now absent from us. Defend them from all dangers of soul and body; and grant that both they and we, drawing nearer to thee, may be bound together by thy love in the communion of thy Holy Spirit, and in the fellowship of thy saints; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *People Amen*.

LORD OUR GOD, accept the fervent prayers of thy people; in the multitude of thy mercies, look with compassion upon us and all who turn to thee for help; for thou art gracious, O lover of souls, and to thee we give glory, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and for ever. *¶People Amen*.
