The Second Lesson 1 Peter 2:2-10

IKE NEWBORN BABES, LONG FOR THE PURE SPIRITUAL MILK, that by it you may grow up to salvation; for you have tasted the kindness of Ithe Lord. Come to him, to that living stone, rejected by men but in God's sight chosen and precious; and like living stones be yourselves built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture: "Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and he who believes in him will not be put to shame." To you therefore who believe, he is precious, but for those who do not believe, "The very stone which the builders rejected has become the head of the corner," and "A stone that will make men stumble, a rock that will make them fall"; for they stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were no people but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy but now you have received mercy.

One of the first American hymns to gain wide acceptance in England, this text was authored by Bishop Doane of New Jersey, a distinguished scholar, church leader, and man of letters. His inspiration was the words of Jesus, "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). Each of the three words is developed in a single stanza with the final summation in verse 4 in the form of a prayer.

And when I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. And you know the way where I am going." Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but by me. If you had known me, you would have known my Father also; henceforth you know him and have seen him." Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and we shall be satisfied." Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and yet you do not know me, Philip? He who has seen me has seen the Father; how can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own authority; but the Father who dwells in me does his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father in me; or else believe me for the sake of the works themselves. Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I go to the Father. Whatever you ask in my name, I will do it, that the Father may be glorified in the Son; if you ask anything in my name, I will do it."

#### The Nicene Creed

And we most humbly beseech thee, of thy goodness, O Lord, to comfort and succor all those who, in this transitory life, are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity.

And we also bless # thy holy Name for all thy servants departed this life in thy faith and fear, beseeching thee to grant them continual growth in thy love and service; and to grant us grace so to follow the good examples of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Blessed Michael and All Angels, Blessed George, and of all thy saints, that with them we may be partakers of thy heavenly kingdom.

Grant these our prayers, O Father, for Jesus Christ's sake, our only Mediator and Advocate. ¶ People Amen.

Celebrant Let us humbly confess our sins unto Almighty God.



And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe to bless and sanctify, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, these thy gifts and creatures of bread and wine; that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we, and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee that we, and all others who shall be partakers of this Holy Communion, may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, be filled # with thy grace and heavenly benediction, and made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him.

And although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offenses, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

This hymn, new to the Hymnal 1982, is constructed around the persons of the Trinity and is enriched through reference to biblical events associated with each. It is particularly relevant to Confirmation through the reference to the Spirit in verse 3 and how the gift of the Spirit was given at Pentecost. The melody in undergirded by a strong moving bass line that, coupled with the soaring melody in the last line of text, enhances the text dramatically.

# Hymn at the Retiring Procession 182

Truro

The author of this hymn text, Brian Wren, is one of the shining lights in contemporary English hymnody. The poet brilliantly brings the empty Cross and resurrected Christ to the contemporary world rather than consigning it to a place in history. This is widely regarded as one of the finest new hymns about the meaning of the Resurrection.

# This Morning's Liturgy

- † Colors play an important part in the worship of the Church. The colors worn at The Church of St. Michael & St. George are drawn from colors worn in England before the Reformation. They change according to the seasons of the Church year and the liturgical tasks at hand. The vestments worn in the season after Easter are White symbolizing the resurrection of Christ.
- † The text from the Book of Revelation is the centerpiece of the mysterious aura of Paradise, so common to the works of Vaughan Williams. This fanciful piece primarily features a complex unison melody, with several changes of tempo and beat, creating a wonderful choral and spiritual challenge to move as one in voice and intent. † The boisterous joy of Mozart is clear in this crisp bundle of classical praise! The duet between equal voices demands all the precision of a string quartet in the vocal implementation, with fluidity of phrase.
