This Morning's Liturgy

† **Vaughan Williams** was born in Down Ampney and died in London, England. He was educated at Cambridge University and the Royal College of Music. He did additional study in Berlin with Max Bruch and in Paris with Maurice Ravel. He was an active collector of English folk songs and of Tudor church music. His compositions include 9 symphonies, concertos for piano and other instruments as well as chamber music and a large number of both large and small choral works.

He was also the editor of The English Hymnal. Today's organ voluntaries are two of the very few works he wrote for the organ.

† **John Hilton** (the elder) was a countertenor and the organist of Trinity College, Cambridge. He wrote primarily sacred choral works. His son, also John Hilton, was also a composer. Because of the similarity of their work, it is often difficult to determine who composed the works listed under their names.

† Colors play an important part in the worship of the Church. The colors which bedeck the altar and are worn by the clergy are colors worn in England before the Reformation. They change according to the seasons of the church year and the liturgical tasks at hand. The vestments worn in the season after Pentecost are traditionally green. Green is a color that naturally reminds us of hope and growth, and reflects the seasons of Spring and Summer in the natural world. The Church clothes herself in green vestments to express her joyous, lively hope of the ever lovely and eternally lush meadows of the Kingdom of God.
